OPEN LETTER FROM KAMPALA TERROR SUSPECTS - 2010.

LUZIRA PRISON,
14-11-2013.

RE: TO ALL STAKEHOLDERS: JUSTICE DELAYED
IS JUSTICE DENIED.

After more than three years of waiting for Justice to take its Course, we do hereby make notice of our stand to protest. We deem this appropriate after being denied Justice even after lodging Constitutional petitions at the Constitutional Court (No. 55 and 56 of 2011 at the Constitutional Court arising from Nakawa Criminal Case No. 574 of 2010).

We were renditioned to Uganda after being kidnapped from Kenya and others brought from Tanzania without following due legal process.

We have been subjected to both physical and psychological tortures. Since our ordeal started under Solitary Confinement in Luzira prison, this has not made our situation any better. Since we lodged our petitions in 2011 - the State has been extenuating and evasive in its obligation to grant us a fair hearing that: there was lack of quorum at the appellate Court, lack of funds and Citing death of judges among other reasons.

We persevered in our deprivation of justice and eventually judges were appointed and later on a date, long awaited was set; 17th Oct 2013. It was Confirmed by our legal team and families two months prior to it. A production order was issued

and presented to the prison authorities. This Confirmation set us astir that justice has finally come, and an end to our baneful existence.

Our eagerness and excitement evaporated just a few hours before the hearing kicked off - It was called off!

Information we received from the judiciary through a letter was that there was a session in place and a date would be issued during the session.

Our Legal Team contradicted any such session as taking place and were in a black out as far as the case was concerned. There has been no communication from the judiciary in regard to the stalemate.

We have sought legal means including bail applications which we lodged on different occasions to no avail. Our efforts were referred to the Constitutional Court which according to our legal team, the Court has declined forthwith to hear the applications.

The medical state of affairs of some detainees is critical. They suffer from High blood pressure, Chronic ulcers, hernia, failing eye sight, joint pains, kidney and liver complications to mention but a few. This has been exacerbated by the lack of specialised medical personnel or access to the same.













Much as the prison authorities try to assuage and allay our fears, it seems clear to proceed to No. 3

Our stand to protest against our indefinite detention without a fair hearing is rooted in our humanity and love for freedom and peace for all without distinction in colour or creed.
